

Willie Maeobia
from **Australia**:

"USA gymnast Simone Biles and Jamaican sprinter Usain Bolt both inspired me so much. Simone was raised by her grandparents to fame and greatness, the nurturing done by her grandmother in guiding her passion and listening and allowing her to make the right choices made me proud. Usain Bolt refusing to accept defeat in 2004 in Athens, went home and put in the needed work and discipline to succeed. He reminds me of a school motto: "Success Through Effort." These two remind me of something: You don't need to leave your country to achieve greatness. Greatness is on the inside."

"The most memorable part was the innovative, Opening Ceremony, done with creative and artistic ability to make such a grand occasion. I am very proud of Michael Phelps for his outstanding performance, which came from his ability to persevere and stay focused on the achievement of his goals. I never had direct contact with any of the athletes but they have motivated me to be courageous, humble and strive to become a successful individual."

"What impressed me most were that 205 different nations participated which all raised their flags in the opening and closing ceremonies. It is really emotional watching the event. What made me proudest was Fiji's Rugby Sevens team winning Fiji's first Olympic medal - a gold! It was a really happy moment for me as a Pacific Islander because it is the first Pacific nation to win a gold medal in the Games."

"The best moment was when Nigeria's football team beat Denmark 2 - 0 in the quarter finals (and won a bronze medal). I know John Obi Mikel the Nigerian captain, who plays for Chelsea in England."

"Britain's Mo Farah made me proudest. He tripped and fell but got up and still won the race. I know Mo Farah, he is from Gabilay village, Somaliland originally, which is the country that I live in."

"Fiji, a Pacific Island country, won the first Olympic Rugby Sevens - Hooray! I know Rosefelo our sprinter."

Jude from St. Lucia:

"I watched the Olympics every night until it ended. I admired the performances of the Jamaican athletes Usain Bolt, Elaine Thompson and Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce. Usain Bolt made history by winning both 100m and 200m. He had a brilliant smile at the end of the finish line. I am so proud of him to be a citizen of a country in the Caribbean. I know Levers Spencer, a high jumper from St Lucia - who has competed at 3 Olympic Games - even though she didn't perform her best at these Games."

"My most memorable moment was when Pita Taufatofua, Tonga's flag-bearer, appeared at the opening ceremony. The taekwondo athlete came out topless, wearing traditional Tongan dress and was covered in baby oil. It was great to see Mark Cavendish achieve a silver medal in cycling as I know his family, but the whole British Cycling Team were amazing."

"To me, the most memorable part of the event was when the Nigerian boxer Efe Ajagba knocked out his opponent in just 22 seconds of the first round, even though he ended up losing to Kazakhstan boxer Ivan Dychko. The athlete am proud of is Usain Bolt the Jamaican who is consistent in his performances in all the competitions that he faces. I know my South Sudanese countrymen Guor Marial who competed in 2012 as an independent athlete and this year 2016 joined by Santino Kenyi as our flag bearers representing our country South Sudan."
