A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

★ The origins of this British International College of Professional Management date back **85 years to the year 1935**. One of the Founders was academician **Dr Joseph Lee**. Dr Lee is the **uncle** of the current Principal of the College.

★ The original focus of this renowned institution was providing tuition for school certificates, higher certificates and professional examinations for people living in Britain. Then during **World War II**, the College began training British Services Personnel overseas, with centres in locations worldwide. After the War more centres were established, in the **Middle East, the Mediterranean, Africa and Arabia**. Depending on the type and location of training provided, College 'branches' operated as the **British School of Careers, British Tutorial Institute, British Tutorial College**, or **Trans-World Correspondence College**.

★ On **1st May 1958**, **Dr Stephen Lawson** (the current Principal of the College) moved from London to begin work with Dr Lee at the College's main East African headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya. Together they introduced new and exciting **correspondence courses** which enabled a wide range of people with different backgrounds, educations and nationalities to benefit from training and studies which had not previously been available to them. Many courses were specially written for citizens of "developing countries", whose main language was not necessarily English. Those innovative courses had a strong emphasis on providing **Careers Training** for people who had the ambition **to achieve successful careers**.

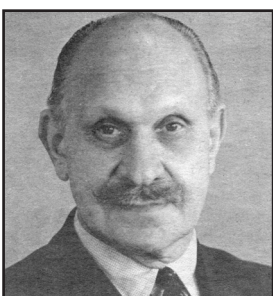
★ In the 1970's the international Headquarters was set up in **Jersey, Britain**. More Courses were specially written in a **friendly style** in **straightforward English** for people all over the world to study and easily master, and the College's Membership spread to **over 200 countries**. From the 1970s to the 2000s there were two study options; Cambridge Tutorial College correspondence courses were assessed by open-book assignments and tests, and College of Professional Management course assessments were by supervised examination.

★ **In 1988 Dr Lawson's daughter Keren joined the College** to help manage the International Enquiries & Dispatch Centre in England, and **in 1994 Dr Lawson's son David joined the College** staff and is now the Vice Principal & Director of Studies. David's own oldest child has now Graduated with an MA, is a teacher, and has also worked with the College. **Four generations** of the Lawson family have now worked with the College, and they consider anyone who studied with the College since 1935 to be **"part of the family"**.

★ Today the College is **internationally accredited**, is a **registered UK learning provider**, is renowned for its **high-quality education and service**, and has partner organisations (Affiliates/Associates) in over 30 countries. It is estimated that **over three million people** around the world have been trained and educated since 1935.
