International Relations (IR) studies the relationships among the world's States and governments and aims to understand the behaviour and actions of other 'actors' such as multinational corporations, businesses, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), international institutions, groups and individuals. IR incorporates numerous topics including philosophy, political world history, law and economics, foreign policy, domestic policy, international politics, war and conflict, human rights, globalization, statesmanship and diplomacy, society and culture, feminism and gender, development, world-systems theory, media, and lots more.

Some scholars use the term Global Politics instead of IR as they feel it better describes the world's political patterns and interactions.

IR uses a 'Levels of Analysis framework' to analyse the effect of global events at four levels: Individual, Domestic, International, and Global, and to understand how different IR theories can interpret events. Key IR theories include 'Realism' which says States are egotistical - meaning selfish and competitive - and that States always act in their own self-interest to achieve greater power for the nation. The key opposing theory is Liberalism, which focuses on cooperation and interdependence, and says that peace comes about between States through democracy, a balance of power, and international harmony.

CIC's Diploma in International Relations & Global Politics is an excellent introduction to the 'discipline' of IR and its theories and concepts; higher level studies are available too.
